MUSICAL NOTES By Cantor Lorna Wallach

n behalf of my family, I would like to take this opportunity to express our gratitude to the entire CBI community for your support, good wishes and generosity on the occasion of the *Bat Mitzvah* of our daughter Shira. We are deeply touched! Preparing for this experience with advice and guidance from so many of you, and sharing the actual day with our extended CBI family added immensely to our joy and made this important milestone an even



more meaningful celebration! Being part of such a warm and caring community is truly a blessing!

In addition to the gift of community, music is another great gift to humanity. The Torah speaks of Yuval, "the father of all who play the lyre and the pipe" (Genesis 4:21), and the book of Psalms concludes with a stirring call to praise God with harp and lyre, drum and dance. Without Jewish music, it would be impossible to experience the serenity of *Shabbat*, the silliness of *Purim*, the pathos of *Kol Nidre*, or the joy of *Simchat Torah*. Through music we can express the greatest praise and thanksgiving to God.

I believe that we have all experienced the power of music at some point in our lives. Particularly in Jewish prayer, where music has always played an important role, I've heard many people comment that it is often the melodies of the prayers or singing together as a community which uplifts them, inspires them, or strengthens their connection to God and to their Jewish heritage. But this is more complex than it seems, because not all types of music speak to everybody, and when the familiar melodies are changed, some people feel uncomfortable and distanced from the prayers. One of my primary tasks as a Cantor is to transmit a part of our Jewish heritage through the medium of music. Several times last spring and summer, we began our *Kabbalat Shabbat* services at an earlier time on Friday evening so that we could enjoy musical accompaniment for the services, provided by our own CBI volunteer band. The turnout was great and the *ruach* (spirit) of the service was amazing.

We look forward once again to our instrumentally enhanced *Kabbalat Shabbat* services to be held this summer on **Friday night JUNE 22 and AUGUST 3, both at 7:00 PM**. Please note the earlier start time.

I encourage all of you to make every effort to join us in welcoming *Shabbat* through a spiritual and spirited Friday night experience in which children of all ages are welcome to attend. Let us lift our voices together in singing a new song unto God.

President's Message By Jonathan Engel, CBI President

Liturgy

A t Congregation B'nai Israel we take pride in cleaving tightly to the liturgy of mainstream Ashkenazi orthodoxy, brought to these shores in the waning decades of the 19th century by the great waves of Central European Jewish immigrants fleeing Czarist-era pogroms. Our recitation of the *amidah*, *shma*, *barchu*, *psukei d'zimrah*, and *tefilloth* specific to various holidays is virtually identical to that of 100 years ago. And although our Cantor makes a valiant effort to inject new melodies into the service, and our Rabbi makes efforts to glean new lessons from Torah, we are constrained in our worship by our tradition.

Jews have wrestled with their liturgy over the past two centuries, and from the radical reforms of the German reform movement and Hungarian neologues to the more gentle evolutionary approach of the Conservative Laws Committee have struggled to find the right balance of tradition and relevance. The latest siddur of the Reform movement, Mishkan T'fila, which has been replacing Gates of Prayer over the past few years in Reform Temples nationwide, urges that movement's liturgy back toward a more traditional style with more Hebrew and restored tefilloth. At the same time modern Orthodox congregations are taking strategic aim at the mehitzah and experimenting with halachically acceptable roles of women as *ba'alai tefillah*. One of the most innovative of these groups, congregation Darhhei Noam on Manhattan's Upper West Side, has actually created a tripartite prayer space, with separate areas for male and female worship, and a co-ed area from which to read the Torah: an arrangement deemed consistent with historical minhagei Yisrael by professor Daniel Sperber of Bar Ilan University's Talmud department.

At Congregation B'nai Israel. our members express their preferences davening through the Religious Affairs Committee which, in conjunction with Rabbi Bayer, tries to create opportunities for our diverse congregants to find a spiritually accessible space while



maintaining the essential integrity of the siddur. The task is not easy. The committee has considered such questions as the appropriate role of musical instruments on Shabbat, amplified voices, English translations, a streamlined Psukei d'Zimrah, and a shortened Musaf Amidah, to say nothing of the timing of Kabbalat Shabbat and Slichot services, Our Journeyers' Minyan meets twice monthly for those who prefer more of a "worship and study" approach to prayer, and of course our many youth services provide different points of access to Jewish prayer appropriate to different age groups. The overarching point is to allow the liturgy to speak to our members, without departing from the essential tenets of Conservative Judaism in which, to quote Rabbi Mordechai Kaplan, "the past has a vote, but not a veto." (Kaplan can also be credited with the dictate that while we "struggle to hear the voices of our ancestors," we must also "struggle to hear our own voices as distinct from theirs.")

If you feel that your distinct prayer voice is not being heard, I urge you to speak with our clergy as well as the Religious Affairs Committee. Our services are ever evolving, and we know that a liturgy frozen in time will ultimately lose its relevance. Our faith exists to serve us in our own time, even as we struggle to absorb the wisdom

A nother year of BBRS has come to an end. With a loud "Amen" and a beautiful singing of *Hatikvah* our annual *Maccabiah* (for grades 3-5) drew to a close. The theme of this academic color war was the *Shevatim* (the biblical tribes). Unbeknownst to many of the students, between the singing and the creating of Israeli maps and banners, there was a large amount of education going on. Our Zayin class graduated on May 10 - Lag b'Omer. A graduation designed and executed by the students themselves. From the origami flowers on the tables to the speeches written by students it was an evening that demonstrated their strong attachment to Judaism and especially CBI. A new addition, the students finished their ceremony and then took their places around tables to show their graduation projects. This year, each 7th grader was invited to choose a topic of interest, study it through the internet and create a presentation. From sports in Israel to memories of the Holocaust, each project was unique and showed love for their topic. A special thanks to the Zayin teachers who supervised the preparations and to Max Retik, a 9th grade madrikh, who supervised the closing movie.

A common theme that underlies this article is the input of our students whether in kindergarten or in high school. We strongly believe that their opinions count and we consider them as we plan for the coming year. On the last day of classes for them, the 7th graders on the verge of graduating were asked what they would change in our program. A few wanted more Holocaust study, a better sense of Jewish history, more conversational Hebrew and some even asked for homework. With their ideas in mind we plan for the future. The same night, *Tichon* - our high school program – met for the last time. After an evening spent making a map of Israel out of chocolate and goodies (with thanks to our newest teacher, **Mike Greenstein**), they joined the congregation for *maariv*. Through a survey on Google documents, these students will give us input on next year's programming. But to the congregation, their growth can be seen as more than 7 of them have taken to the *bima* on Monday nights and with a bit of hesitation but pride led the congregation in prayer.

So the year ends on the academic front, and the work begins to update, design and put into place next year's program. Thank you all for a great year!

- Ilisa Perlman for overseeing the re-opening of our gift shop in our new building



MEN'S CLUB: MAY WE BE STRENGTHENED

s I write this article, my final one as CBI Men's Club President, we are arriving at the end of the book of Leviticus with the reading of *Parashat Bechukotai*. As is customary on *Shabbat* when we reach the end of each book of the Torah, the congregation will stand for the last *aliyah* and chant the words *"chazak chazak v'nitchazek"* ("Be strong, be strong and may we be strengthened") when the reader completes the final verse.



The reader will then respond by chanting these same powerful words.

I find this custom to be especially poignant at this moment because just as we reach the end of Leviticus and begin a new chapter in the book of Numbers with renewed strength, I reach the end of my term as president and Men's Club begins a new chapter with new leadership and with renewed vigor. 

t recent Shabbat services, as we prepared to call the *Kohane Aliyah*, the *b'nai mitzvah* family did not list one. Nor was there a *Kohane* congregant...or so we thought. As Rabbi Bayar asked one final time, "Is there a *Kohane* present", whose hand was raised? None other than our own Ethel Rosenfeld.


Ethel's father was a *Kohane*. However, the Synagogues she attended in her lifetime were either non-egalitarian or simply not aware of her priestly status. How special it was then, when Ethel fervently chanted, for the first time, the *Kohane aliyah*. She was then properly regaled with a congregational chorus of *Simentov and Mazeltov*, which customarily is bestowed upon a congregant who publicly performs a skill for the first time...in Ethel's case, after 99 years.

If you've concluded that Ethel is closing in on a triple digit birthday, you'd be correct, though you would never know it.

The mother and mother-in-law of Nan and Howard Greenwald, Ethel was born in the Chelsea section of Manhattan, and graduated from Julia Richman High School on the Upper East Side. Ethel proudly notes that this high school was the first to be named after a woman.

Ethel's first job was in sales, at Macy's Department Store, while in high school. After graduating, she took evening accounting courses at City College and worked in the hotel industry. She married her husband Ernest in 1939, and enjoyed 60 years of marriage until he passed away in 1999. Ethel and Ernest, originally from Irvington, operated a retail store, "The Spice Shop" for many years. They joined B'nai Israel when daughter Nan became President in 1997. Ethel is also the mother of Ira, and grandmother of Elyse, Amy, Marci and Wendy.

At age 96, Ethel finally, reluctantly, turned in

her driver's license. At age 98, she travelled to Chicago, taking a train, boat and bus over a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ week period.

What are her travel plans this summer? Simply a solo flight from Newark to Buffalo, then to Chattaqua, a well know artist colony outside of Buffalo, where she'll attend lectures and musical programs.

Asked the secret to her longevity, Ethel quietly demurred, saying she didn't feel qualified to offer advice. After all, she said, "I'm not even 100"...(*Editor's note, not yet*).

We wish Ethel Rosenfeld "Yasher Koach". May you go from strength to strength, and continue to inspire us.



Rabbi Bayar hosted a parlor meeting on November 15 to encourage congregants to attend the 2012 AIPAC Policy Conference in Washington DC.

Nancy and I attended a Friends of the IDF choral concert at Adath Shalom in Morris Plains for the second consecutive year. It was a wonderful event.

Men's Club and Sisterhood Book Clubs sponsored several books with Israel related themes this year. Men's club books included <u>Yoni's Last Battle</u>, <u>The Rescue at Entebbe</u>, a biography about Yoni Netanyahu, and <u>To the End of the Land</u>, a novel by David Grossman. 




