## FROM THE RABBI'S DEN

he second Temple, Jerusalem and the independent Jewish state were all destroyed by the Romans in 70 CE. The remnants of rabbinic leadership gathered at a town called Yavneh. There, they restructured Jewish law and tradition forming the foundation of what we still celebrate as Judaism today.



As you would expect the survivors were strongwilled, independent and dedicated to saving what was left of the people and identity. They did not however agree on the methods by which Judaism could be preserved. They fought and argued. Their arguments form the basis of what we call the Talmud.

One of their disagreements was over the cause of the destruction. Was it God's punishment for Covenantal violations or was it human inflicted without God's intervention? They eventually agreed that the destruction was caused by "baseless hatred" of one person to another. Baseless hatred was defined as "hating a person for no rational reason" or "hating a person just because they disagreed with you."

They created a teaching that resounds to us to this very day:

"I am a creature of God and my neighbor is also a creature of God. I work in the city and he works in the country. I rise early to work and he rises early for his work. Just as he cannot excel in my work, I cannot excel in his work. Will you say that I do great things and he does small things? We have learned that it does not matter whether a person does much or little, as long as he directs his heart to heaven." (Berakhot 17a)

This text holds true for individuals, families, communities and countries as well. Baseless hatred destroys the fabric of the community. It's cure is loyalty acceptance and love of one person to another.

## **MUSICAL NOTES**

very Shabbat during the Torah Service, prior to returning the Torah to the Aron Kodesh (ark) we read together (in English) a Prayer for our Country. Given that this month we will elect the next President of the United States of America. I thought it would be appropriate to take a deeper look at this prayer that we say each week. The information I found is from Rabbi Hayim Halevy Donin's book, To Pray as a Jew.



At one time, this may have been a prayer for the

king, but today it is a prayer for the country and its government. Originally the prayer included such requests as, "Put compassion into the king's heart and into the heart of his counselors and nobles, that they may deal kindly with us and with all Israel," serving as a reminder of the days when the fate of the Jew depended on the whim of the king and his counselors. In more modern times, the wording of the prayer has been changed to fit the situation. Though the custom of praying for the welfare of the government did not become part of the synagogue liturgy until about the fourteenth century, it is based on an ancient tradition. The prophet Jeremiah counseled the Jews who were taken into the Babylonian captivity saying, "Seek the welfare of the city to which the Lord exiled you, and pray to God for it; for in the peace thereof shall you also find peace." (Jer. 29:7) Also in the book of Ezra we read that the Jews "prayed for the life of the king and his sons." (6:10). Although we recite the prayer shortly before we return the Torah to the Ark, the Sephardic custom is to recite a prayer for the government on Yom Kippur evening-- right after Kol Nidrei.

The inclusion of the prayer in the service is based on the Mishnah (Avot 3:2). Rabbi Hanina said, "pray for the welfare of the government for were it not for the fear of the government, men would swallow each other up alive." Though this is a rather frightening description of anarchy, the Talmud deals with its essential truth, not only for primitive society, but even for many places in the world today. Since government contributes to a stable and orderly society, a prayer for the welfare of the leaders of the government became an integral part of synagogue custom.

Let us hope and pray that whichever candidate is elected to serve as our nation's next President, along with all the newly elected and appointed leaders, they will govern justly and fairly, and that our country will continue to be an influence for good throughout the world, and that we will soon see peace between all nations.

"WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE A HOST CONGREGATION?" — As one of 25 host congregations in Essex County CBI will provide shelter for up to 5 families or 14 people. The families will be housed in the BBRS wing from Sunday, November 6<sup>th</sup> through Sunday, November 13<sup>th</sup>. CBI will furnish sleeping quarters, a dining room and lounge area where CBI volunteers will provide meals and offer hospitality. The families will be with us from 5:30 p.m.—7:00 a.m. on weekdays and all day Saturday and Sunday.

# Engaging Israel: Jewish Values and the Israeli-Palestinian Conflict

A Hartman Institute Lecture & Study Series

Through video lectures, text study, and lively group discussion, we are pleased to bring the world-renowned faculty of the Shalom Hartman Institute to Congregation B'nai Israel and the Greater MetroWest community.

iEngage: Jewish Values and the Israeli-Palestinian Conflict explores one of the most divisive issues affecting the Jewish people today: the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. Through the study of Jewish narratives about Israel and the unpacking of the complex meanings of peace in Jewish tradition, participants are invited to explore the ideas and values that animate different attitudes toward the conflict and how these values shape their own political understandings. Though a shared political platform may not be attainable, this course strives to achieve a shared respect for our differences.

Together we will engage in a new values-based discourse about Israel, including topics such as: Living with Difference, the Israel We Imagine, Jewish Narratives of Peace, Attitudes Towards the Land, Justice, Self-Preservation, Compromise, and the Idea of Jewish Exceptionalism.



But make no mistake, the wrath will be present.

Furthermore, the library is pleased to announce the addition of two new books to our collection: The Exodus by Leon Uris, and *The Marrying of Chani Kaufman* by Eve Harris.

This article also marks the beginning of our series of book reviews, giving you a peek into our large and varied collection. This month's selection is *A Life of Menasseh Ben Israel* by Cecil Roth.

"In short, he was a man without passion, without triviality, but, alas, without wealth."

So described is Rabbi Menasseh Ben Israel, the man who represented Jewish learning and scholarship in the 1600s. Though it appears to be a biography of this simple, goodhearted man, this book actually represents a much larger story: the exodus of Spanish Jews fleeing the Inquisition into Amsterdam, the growth of their religious and intellectual culture there, the troubles they and their brethren faced abroad, and ultimately Menasseh's mission to win them acceptance in England. With a focus on the interaction between Jewish and Christian scholarship of the time, and Menasseh's huge role in defining that interaction, this book explores Menasseh's rippling impact throughout Europe and his unlikely success at the mission of his life— after he had already died of a broken heart.


