FROM THE RABBI'S DEN

his month we celebrate the holiday of Purim. We will dress up, make noise and play games in addition to hearing the story of Purim. We will read how Mordechai and Esther defeated the evil Haman and thwarted his nefarious scheme to destroy the Jewish people. There is little thought that goes into the observance of Purim. It is after all a holiday for children to celebrate.

Our tradition has always held Purim at arm's length, so to speak. We don't' really know what to



do with it. Like so many other stories events we do well not to look too closely at the story – for the events described in the Megillah are troubling, to say the least. The closer we investigate the narrative the more questions we find.

For at its core Purim deals with the capriciousness of life; it reminds us how frail our political stability is and how quickly freedom and comfort can turn into persecution and fear. The Jewish community of Persia had its two greatest leaders named after Persian gods; Mordechai (Marduk) and Esther (Ishtar). How assimilated they must have become!

Mordechai is one of the king's closest advisors, Esther is the king's wife – yet they are powerless to prevent the king's chief advisor (Haman) from inserting a plot that will at once make the king wealthy and rid the kingdom of its Jews. How did they let that happen?

It is only when Mordechai and Esther finally assert their identity – as Jews, that they are able to thwart Haman. He and his plot are destroyed – but at what cost? Purim teaches us that constant vigilance is the least we must have. We must constantly be aware of the potential for destruction even in the countries most friendly to us.

Perhaps that is why the Rabbis decreed that cross dressing and alcohol were valid customs for Purim – Purim teaches us to be ever vigilant and necessity of finding joy whenever we can.

Ginny and I wish all of you a merry joyous and meaningful Purim.

This month (the Hebrew month of Adar) we celebrate Purim. And a very festive celebration it will be at CBI!! Following Megillah reading on erev Purim, Saturday night, **March 11**, our CBI volunteer band will play for a Purim party in the Social Hall with dancing, singing, refreshments and socializing!

Although the Passover Festival is not observed until April this year, we at CBI will have an early celebration of Passover at our biennial Sisterhood Women's Seder on **March 22**, which I will co-lead with Rabbi Helaine Ettinger.



Since we'll be celebrating both of these holidays within 2 weeks of each other this month, I have been thinking about the connection between them. Rashi, the classical commentator, explains that when Adar comes, our joy increases because it is the time of the miracles of Purim and of Passover (Talmud Taanit 29a). While both holidays have miracles, there are differences between the two miracles. I read an article by Menachem Levinsohn in The Jewish Magazine (Feb. 2007) which gave what I thought was a very insightful distinction.

Levinsohn writes that the miracle of Passover was a conglomeration of several miracles from the ten plagues through to the Exodus from Egypt via the splitting of the Red Sea. The revelations of G-d were absolutely apparent to all, from the simplest person to the greatest. It was a time of many miracles that were beyond the realm of nature and in fact shattered the laws of nature. In contrast, the miracle of Purim did not manifest itself in a manner that was apparent to many, unless they considered and analyzed the events that transpired at that time.

Most people view the miracles of Passover as being greater, but why do we experience greater happiness and joy on Purim? Levinsohn's explanation is that the awesomeness of the open miracles of Passover were too lofty for us to enjoy. They not only terrified the Egyptians, but they put us into an extreme state of awe and trepidation. Also, these miracles were solely G-d's doing so we were not in charge of our fate. We were pawns in a drama that G-d was playing with the Egyptians.

Purim's miracles, on the other hand, were not overbearing to us. Like the Exodus from Egypt, we knew that we were in a state of danger, but unlike the Exodus, it was the Jews who took the initiative and participated in their own redemption. All of the Jews in Persia fasted to change the evil decree and it worked! Our senses were working and we perceived our own success, we were alive and delighted!

We see that each type of miracle has a certain advantage. We need the miracles that remind of us G-d's presence and power, but we also need to be proactive about our own fate and in searching for the Divine in our lives. The Passover miracle brings unbelievable changes in nature, obvious revelation of G-dliness and puts everyone under tremendous fear, whereas the Purim miracle is one that is almost imperceptible unless we employ active contemplation, yet it is the type of miracle that we can enjoy.

This also teaches that as human beings, we are capable of accomplishing so much more when we are in a state of joy than when we feel overwhelmed, afraid or depressed. As we celebrate Purim and then Passover, it is my hope that we as individuals and as a community will be proactive about finding ways to bring holiness into our lives and recognize G-d's miracles that occur daily. And may our joy increase so that we may be capable of accomplishing even more and spreading our light and joy to those who need it.


Rabbi Bayar continues to teach on Monday and Thursday mornings, and always welcomes new adult learners to his classes.



traveled from near and far. Eve thanks the Rabbi and Cantor for helping her prepare for her Bat Mitzvah.




Madeline and Eva Hilzenrath March 25
