FROM THE RABBI'S DEN

n 1953, David Ben Gurion wrote that "In two thousand years of Diaspora our creativity did not completely disappear, but the light of the Torah was dimmed in the Diaspora, since the light of the people Israel was dimmed. Only with the renewal of Hebrew independence can we understand the true and full light of the Torah." Moshe Halbertal, a scholar who addressed our congregation last year commented on this, "Zionism, a movement of return to the Land, exemplifies the return of the



Jews to the body. Only once back in the Land can Jews rediscover the true nature of the Bible and its deepest meanings."

In this interpretation the land of Israel provides the body to the people of Israel which provides the soul. Body cannot exist without soul. Soul cannot exist without body. This explains both the importance of each component and their interrelationship.

This coming month we will celebrate and commemorate various aspects of both the body and soul of Judaism: Lag B'omer, Israel Independence Day, Yom Yerushalayim, Holocaust Remembrance Day and Shavuot all fall within this month. Each of these days reminds us of a historical or spiritual moment which contributed to our communal identity and aids us in creating continuity from generation to generation.

Ironically we tend to take both the State of Israel and the Torah for granted. We assume that they will both always be there for us, available whenever we need them. We don't realize that the unique quality that has kept and sustained us over the centuries is our ability to interact with aspects of our tradition.

The State of Israel and the Torah are interactive entities; if we don't involve ourselves in them they will cease to exist for us.

I look forward to seeing you during these observances this month.

President's Message

"Here I am"...For some strange reason these words, found in the Book of Genesis, came to my mind after my time at AIPAC this year. I had been to AIPAC before but not while President of our synagogue. For those of you who know me, I don't love American politics, I shy away from those discussions, and, I did not lobby on the Hill. Nonetheless, I



love Israel and often yearn to visit. This year, I came away with a sense that I must continue to support AIPAC for many other reasons. I was educated on the issues facing Israel and Jews (because issues Israel deals with, by default, Jews around the world deal with); I was enlightened with knowledge about the amazing technological advances being made in Israel and the people that are helped by them around the world; and I became aware that more than 4000 students were impacted similarly by their experience and association with AIPAC. And that, I believe, is the biggest reason to support the policy conference.

We spend countless classes and time trying to get the attention and commitment of our upcoming leaders. Here is a place where they are embraced into a community, in a matter of days, and given great meaning in their Jewish lives. For modern American Jews, bred in an atmosphere of religious pluralism and consumerist freedom of choice, the question of what it is to be Jewish seems to be growing more complicated with every generation. This year we learned that interfaith

marriages continue to rise, the challenges associated with synagogue membership continue as synagogue boards address including non-jewish partners as full members with voting rights, and the next generations appear to be joining shuls less. So when a Jewish organization hosts a conference where almost 25% of its attendees are students, they have done something right in my mind. They have considered the next generation - the future. I applaud and support them for that!

I have spent over 3 years as B'nai Israel's President, and hope I have imparted a sense that we must look to our future and future leaders. I hope I have brought programs that encourage your passionate acceptance of leadership to our community and have set us up to create a vision together for a future B'nai Israel that will continue to say, "Here I Am" ready to engage in the challenges, opportunity and change that has always been part of our Jewish legacy.

Please join us at this year's Annual Meeting on Wednesday June 7. We have an amazing slate of dedicated officers and trustees to present to you; we have a timeline for our next two years of work leading up to the selection of a new spiritual leader; we, of course, will present the next budget; and you will hear about our challenges and opportunities.

I thank everyone who has supported my efforts these past years. Yasher Koach to you all for helping to continue to build and grow on what our Millburn founders started in 1924.

Mah Jongg Marathon is back!


On Sunday, June 11, Sisterhood will host our 2nd annual round robin Mah Jongg marathon. We will have Mah Jong






This Year's Theme... ISRAEL!







2017 AIPAC Policy Conference March 26 – March 28, 2017

More than 50 CBI congregants attended the 2017 AIPAC Policy Conference. We spent three days in Washington D.C., attended general sessions in both the Washington Convention Center and the Verizon Center,

as well as several personally selected breakout sessions on topics of our own choice. And we lobbied our Senators and Congressmen on issues of importance to the pro-Israel Community.
