If there were an eleventh commandment, what would it be?

That is precisely the question posed to children of different religious denominations, from diverse backgrounds, nationalities, and traditions in the book "The 11th Commandment", published back in 1996, yet ever-relevant (ask your local bookstore to

order a copy for you to purchase). From "no polluting the world" and "feed everyone and eat together", to "no punching" and "do not be mean", the simple wisdom of children resonates with tremendous power. We should all strive to live in a world in which these eleventh commandments are followed.

In just about a week, we will gather to mark Shavuot, the celebration of our receiving the Torah - notably, the 10 commandments - at Mount Sinai. Perhaps because it lacks home rituals or because it falls late in the academic calendar when our focus is already on graduations and summer plans, it seems that Shavuot sometimes gets overshadowed, particularly when compared with our other festivals and holidays. Yet, Shavuot celebrates the beauty of the Torah itself, with an evening study session, eating delicious dairy foods that remind us of the Torah's sweetness, and a recommitment to the traditions of our People.

This year, Shavuot will include in-person and online opportunities for gathering, engagement, learning, prayer, and - most importantly - cheesecake! We look forward to your participation.

## **Musical Notes** By Cantor Lorna Wallach





In the midst of this period of counting that we're in on the Jewish calendar (the seven weeks from Pesach to Shavuot), I have reached a personal milestone this month as I mark 30 years since my graduation from the Cantorial School at the Jewish Theological Seminary. JTS began ordaining female cantors in 1987, and with four women in my

graduating class of 1991, I was one of the first ten women to be invested as a Hazzan in the Conservative movement and to be granted membership in the Cantors Assembly (founded as the professional organization of Conservative Cantors, which now also includes Cantors serving congregations in other movements) when they first started accepting women in 1990.

Growing up without female role models in leadership positions in my family's traditional, non-egalitarian synagogue, it was a process for me to come to realize that my voice as a Conservative Jewish woman mattered. As a "pioneer" in the Cantorate because I'm a woman, I have had to navigate a great deal of uncharted territory. While on my journey to become and serve as a Cantor, I did face obstacles such as gender discrimination and resistance to change, but I have also been blessed to find great support and encouragement from teachers at JTS, many male cantorial colleagues, the Rabbis with whom I have shared the pulpit, my family, and especially from the members of this congregations and other synagogues where I have worked (a special shout out of gratitude to all of you throughout my 22 years at CBI!). My own life's journey has certainly sensitized me to have a greater appreciation that everyone has their own story and each of our stories are valuable and meaningful.

The recent initiative at CBI to focus on making a greater commitment to embrace diversity and to make our congregation a place where everyone feels welcome and included is an important and exciting opportunity. A community is made up of many different opinions and perspectives, and we at CBI want to acknowledge and celebrate our diversity and empower each of our members to feel that your voice matters and your viewpoint is valid.

As clergy, it is a privilege and a joy to teach and share

knowledge and also to gain knowledge and insights from students (of all ages!) in the process. For many years, CBI has had a model of encouraging all of us to learn from one another - we have congregants teaching Adult Education classes, leading Journeyers minyan, and delivering Divrei Torah on Shabbat and at committee meetings. Our Tikkun Leil Shavuot has also been an occasion for studying and learning together. This is certainly reflected in the theme that Rabbi Isenberg and I chose for this year's Tikkun, "Shivim Panim L'Torah" (Seventy Faces of Torah). There are so many different ways to interpret the Torah with countless related topics to explore. We hope you will participate in this year's Tikkun Leil Shavuot, either in person or via Zoom, perhaps as a teacher (on a topic of your choosing) and as a learner. Let's do whatever we can to support and encourage one another to share our stories and insights. With each voice added to the mix, we strengthen our community, and we keep the Torah and our Jewish heritage relevant and meaningful for the generations to come. May we go forward together from strength to strength.



It is very unusual (in my experience) when something happens in such a big way that it directly impacts the lives of millions of people. Yet this is what we have all just experienced. (or we are all experiencing?)

If you used to attend religious services regularly and now do not that is a direct impact.

If you always prayed in person, or alone and now are praying with zoom, that is a direct impact.

If you changed how you grocery shop, how you shop for clothes, how you are entertained, how or whether you patronize restaurants, how you exercise, or how you stay in touch with your community, you have experienced a direct impact.

If you have been more limited in your access to medical care, either in an emergency or for regular care, or for what is called 'elective' procedures, that is a direct impact.

If you have lost a family member, or a friend to Covid, or to any other illness, you have been impacted in how you were able to mourn, and how your community was able to comfort you.

If you have switched to almost completely on-line education, and on-line activity with organizations you support, I am sure you do not need me to tell you what this impact has been.

And, if you live apart from your family, either close by, or distant, or even more distant you have been affected.

Which brings me to Israel. (metaphorically now, but physically by the time you read this.

We just found out this morning that Israel is beginning to open to non-Israelis. I heard that seniors from GOA (Golda Och Academy) were able to leave to visit Israel, and more directly, I read that Israel is allowing direct relatives of Olim (immigrants to Israel) to visit them. My wife and I fit in that category.

We have had airline tickets to Israel continuously since last March, when we planned to go there for Passover. We have been excellent customers of the airline's free exchange program and are probably on our sixth or seventh version of this trip. As you may know, we missed Passover in Israel once again this year, but we will be there for Shavuot!!

I am an optimist by nature, and it has been difficult for me throughout this time period to continually adjust my expectations in a negative direction. And I continue to be optimistic.

I am taking the (apparent) opening of Israel like a proverbial opening day, with hopes that things are getting better, and that things will (in a way) return to a new normal.

I hope soon (by the end of the summer? or earlier?) we will be able to do many more things in person, be able to socialize with our friends, family and our community.

I hope that we will be able to have conferences like we have in the past and meet in person with our Congressional representatives.

I hope by the end of next year, or early 2023, we can have a congregational trip to Israel, led by Rabbi Isenberg with congregants and their families of various ages, and various levels of experience.

I hope that some of you will share with me, and with our community what you did when you were able to visit Israel and we can return to a strong and in person relationship between our congregation and our families and friends in Israel.

In a sense, this is what we mean at the end of the seder, when we sing, Next Year in Jerusalem!!
