Services will look different this year. Most noticeably, we have split the morning services into three sections: the Shacharit section before the Torah reading will either be indoors and fully socially distanced or outside in the parking lot, the second section will include the Torah service and Musaf and be indoors with limited social distancing, and the third section on Rosh Hashanah will be an outdoor Shofar service. All services held in the sanctuary will be available on Livestream and Zoom, and services from the parking lot will be on Zoom.
