# Musical Notes By Cantor Lorna Wallach

**B**ack in 2013, there was an extremely rare occurrence of Hanukkah coinciding with Thanksgiving. While that won't happen again until 79,811, this year Hanukkah does begin just days after we celebrate Thanksgiving. Even though Thanksgiving is an American holi-



day, we can certainly find ways to connect it to the Jewish festival of Hanukkah.

The American concept of Thanksgiving developed in the colonies of New England, where the religious separatists, who had left England seeking a new home where they could freely practice their faith, shared an autumn harvest feast with Wampanoag Native Americans in November of 1621, celebrating the success of the Pilgrims' first corn harvest. Annual celebrations of the harvest and its bounty actually date back to ancient times and spans many cultures. The Egyptians, Greeks and Romans feasted and paid tribute to their gods after the fall harvest. Thanksgiving also bears a resemblance to our Jewish harvest festival of Sukkot. Historians have also noted that Native Americans had a rich tradition of commemorating the fall harvest with feasting and merrymaking long before the arrival of the Europeans here.

So what's the connection to Hanukkah? Hanukkah marks the celebration of the rededication of the Temple. It also acknowledges the miracle of the military victory of the Maccabees over the Greek-Syrian army and the miracle that the jug of oil, which should have only been enough for one day, lasted 8 days! But there is more to the background of Hanukkah!

In the Second Book of the Maccabees, which quotes from a letter sent circa 125 BCE from the Hasmoneans to the leaders of Egyptian Jewry, the holiday is called "The festival of Sukkot celebrated in the month of Kislev," (rather than Tishrei). Since the Jews were still fighting in caves in Tishrei, 164 BCE, they could not properly honor the eight-day holiday of Sukkot (and Shemini Atzeret), which is a Temple holiday; hence it was postponed until after the recapture of Jerusalem and the purification of the Temple and they even carried Lulavs and offered hymns of praise to G-d. (II Maccabees 10:6-7) This, not the Talmudic legend of the jug of oil, explains the eight day length of Hanukkah -- as a delayed celebration of Sukkot. (from: *A Different Light: The Big Book of Hanukkah*, published by the Shalom Hartman Institute and Devora Publishing)

Hanukkah, like Sukkot and Thanksgiving, is also a time of the

# From the Director of Congregational Learning

5782 began with more excitement than we anticipated with the flooding in our area. But our CBI community came together in the most amazing way to help our families who were affected and

showed up in droves to move everything needed within our CBI building. Hopefully, by the time you are reading this, we will be almost back to "normal." Even with the continuing and diverse challenges, our year of education is off to an amazing start!

We were able to move all of the adjacent High Holiday programming to the two tents in the parking lot. Our Yaldeinu families were so happy to be back together in person for the first time, and we had 20 families at each of our Young Family services. Now that our full schedule of programming is underway, we are excited about all of our new offerings.

#### CBIP

In spite of the many challenges in relocating the preschool classrooms upstairs for the opening of school, we were able to welcome 26 children, and have since added several more. We opened a second class of two-year-olds, hired two new teachers and one new assistant teacher, and extended our hours to 8:00 am to 5:00 pm (4:00 pm on Fridays). Having gotten through a September with two days on and two days off each week, children have now become accustomed to preschool and walking up and down the stairs as they make their way to the playground or social hall. More than half of our students are extending their days, and we know that number will only increase.

New this year, our Tkiya Wee Jam music class for babies through five-year-olds, is off to a rollicking start! We have filled our Sunday morning class, great for working parents, and have a solid crew of families with children age zero to two on Wednesdays. We just opened a second Sunday class.

Bim Bam Shabbat moved to monthly outdoor services on Friday afternoons last spring, and we are looking forward to continuing as the weather permits.

Pre-K Jewish Adventures is a monthly Sunday morning program for families with 3- to 5-year olds focusing on holidays as a "taste" of Sunday school. We had a wonderful first session

in the sukkah and will learn about Shabbat on October 24.

#### BBRS

Having moved the preschool upstairs, BBRS began the year meeting outside in the tents on Sunday mornings and in the social hall on Tuesday afternoons. Every student in grades 3 through 7 also has an individual online Hebrew/Tefillah lesson with a teacher one afternoon a week, scheduled at the family's convenience. We welcome Temple Sha'arey Shalom students to our Sunday program, building a vibrant program together. We have also welcomed 9 new CBI students to our BBRS K-7th grade program!

On Saturday, October 30, we will have our first Shabbat Shelanu, when BBRS families participate in family/youth services and learn about middot/virtues, instead of Sunday school that week.

This year involves getting caught up on various workshops making ritual items that were side-lined by the pandemic. 3rd through 5th grade parents have already decorated siddur covers, and we look forward to planning a Kabbalat Shabbat service to present these students with their siddurim. 5th through 7th graders have designed and assembled yads to use for b'mitzvah, a gift from BBRS.

#### Teens

We have an incredible group of madrichim this year, essential as BBRS meets in alternate locations. Our teen helpers are working with small groups and helping teachers get supplies and manage the logistics of teaching out of the classroom.

We have also compiled a list of CBI teens who are interested in babysitting. This list is available to CBI members. Email Rabbi Julie, <u>RabbiJulie@cbi-nj.org</u>, if you would like a copy.

Tichon, our formal teen education program, has a new focus this year. Each month is a different Mitzvah Module, beginning with text study about a particular focus in Judaism and continuing with a hands-on social action component. In October, 8th through 12th graders learned about Ba'al Taschit, the prohibition against waste, and then designed logo and slogans for CBI's Alliance for Sustainability. In November, teens will learn about Ha'achalat Re'evim, feeding the hungry, and then participate in a Bridges Run, as part of a whole-synagogue project. December brings Pikuach Nefesh, saving a life, and the opportunity to become certified in First Aid/CPR/AED.

gathering of crops. It is the time of the olive harvest, a final time to offer praise and gratitude for God's benevolence. The Midrash Hanukkah states that apart from the Syrian-Greeks' attempts to abolish the cardinal mitzvot of *Shabbat*, *Rosh Chodesh* and *brit milah*, they set their sights on abolishing the holiday of Sukkot.

Rabbi Jay Kelman (Toronto, Canada) says that one of the lessons of Hanukkah is that we should appreciate the opportunity to practice Judaism while we also gain from encounters with the rest of the world. So this year, as we bridge from Thanksgiving to Hanukkah, let us celebrate our dual identities as Jews and as Americans. We are fortunate to live in a society in which we are free to live openly as Jews and to build sacred spaces in which to pray and learn. But at the same time as being thankful, we must be modern day Maccabees, and take action and speak out to make sure that all people are afforded the freedom to practice their faith, and live the lifestyle they choose without fear of being discriminated against, persecuted or terrorized.

Wishing you meaningful and enjoyable celebrations of Thanksgiving and of Hanukkah! (And I still have my Lulav and Etrog lying around should anyone want to make it part of your Hanukkah celebration!!)

# **PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE**

As I write this column, we have just finished reading parshat Noah, recounting the story of the flood and its aftermath. The reading seems particularly apt this year, as we deal with the aftermath of our own flood while still dealing with continuing waves of Covid.

The flooding damage to our building seemed minor at first, with water entering the building through the doorways facing Millburn Avenue and spreading a thin layer of water throughout the preschool wing, the multi-purpose room and the clergy offices. All these rooms require cleanup and repair, in most cases removing the bottom two feet of sheetrock. Separately, our basement flooded, ruining our boiler and hot water heater. We have just finished the cleanup phase of the work, with deep appreciation for the dozens of volunteers who came out in the aftermath of the flooding to remove water-damaged material and move our entire preschool to the upstairs classrooms. Special thanks to congregants Adam and Miri Forster, who responded immediately through Adam's company, PuroClean, to get equipment in place to prevent further moisture damage, and for handling the cleanup effort. Special thanks as well to David Touger for taking charge of the early cleanup.

We have passed the cleanup inspection and are now entering the reconstruction phase. The facilities committee has been instrumental in lining up contractors to do the wall repair work and replace the utilities in our flooded basement. Under the able direction of Jamie Beneroff as our "flood czar", we are expediting these repairs and look forward to returning the preschool kids as quickly as possible to their regular classrooms and the clergy to their offices.

This is not the only construction we have had in our building. Throughout the past several months, we have been making improvements to building security through a Homeland Security grant. These include a new keyless entry system, new security cameras throughout the building, a blast film lining for our windows and decorative benches and planters that double as physical barriers. Special thanks to Bob Brauer and the Homeland Security sub-committee for managing the extensive logistics needed to define our requirements, get quotes, manage the contractors and be successfully reimbursed for the grant.

We are rebuilding in more ways than one, with several new members joining the CBI community in the several weeks and a growing population in the preschool. Our membership committee, led by Paula Touger, has done a phenomenal in reaching out to prospective members and getting them to experience what we have to offer. We look forward to getting to know our new members and celebrating with them throughout the year.

As we conclude our High Holiday Appeal for the year, I'd like to thank everyone who has given so far. If you have not yet had the opportunity to make your pledge, please call or e-mail the office at any time to participate in this important fundraiser. We can't cover all our expenses without your additional support through fundraising, and our need will be greater this year because of unreimbursed flood expenses. Special thanks to Henry Bloom for chairing this effort and to the small group of callers who have reached out to members to solicit donations.

Additional thanks to Dan Dovdovany and the Executive Director search committee for all the hard work they did finding and vetting candidates. I am happy to welcome Paul Gibilisco as our new executive director and look forward to working with him. While Joel Goldman's time with us as interim director was short, he has proven to be a mensch and we wish him luck in future endeavors.

The purpose of our Israel Bonds campaign is to encourage many of our members to participate, in whatever amount you feel is appropriate. Purchasing bonds is an investment, not a contribution so the dollars you invest are always yours (or your recipients). And while you are permitted to purchase in large amounts, purchasing in \$36 or \$100 increments is also available. I believe that Israel Bonds make a perfect Bar or Bat Mitzvah (or Chanukah) gift, because Mazal Tov bonds may be purchased beginning at only \$36, and the gift sends the message that bonding with Israel is important to you and to the recipient.

## We have had quite a year.

I wrote in the May/June Bulletin about the challenges of our lives during the time of Corona, and about how our relationship with Israel has been affected. I can give you a brief update now.

Nancy and I have been able to visit Israel twice this year, once from April to early June, and once in August to mid-October. During both visits, Corona affected what we were able to do, but, except for the first week in the second visit, we were not in bidud - (pronounced "be dude") Hebrew for quarantine.

During both trips, we were able to visit restaurants (eating outside most of the time), but we always had our vaccination documentation with us. Schools were generally open, but when positive cases occurred there were rules governing who would be in bidud, and for how long.

As I write this in October, I see optimistic press reports on the possible opening of the country for tourists, but all of this is subject to change, the most constant feature of our current situation.

I am hopeful that as 2021 winds down, many of you who have not been able to travel to Israel, will be able to. If you are going, let me know and then we can share our experiences with the community.

I am taking a little liberty to change the conclusion of the seder, and say, Next Year in the Land of Israel!!

# Ambucycle dedicated to CBI Millburn - Thank you to Neil Yaris

We would like to thank Neil Yaris who helped collect funds from friends and colleagues of his, and members of our community, and dedicated the life saving Ambucyle as a gift from members and friends of Congregation B'nai Israel, Millburn, NJ. Earlier this year, Neil provided me with a short history of the project:



In the spring of 2017, my mother and I attended the AIPAC Conference. We met the representatives from an organization called "United Hatzalah" in the basement of the hotel and were completely floored by what we heard. A free, first responders unit in Israel that could get to those in need far faster than traditional ambulances, please tell me more! We quickly went to a nearby hotel to meet the founder, Eli Beer, and heard about their success in saving lives in Israel. We were hooked!

Upon our return to New Jersey, I explored starting a mitzvah project with Hatzalah in the name of CBI Millburn. I met with Rabbi Sharon and was encouraged by her to follow thru on my goal to raise the \$36,000 needed to name an ambucycle in honor of CBI. We held an event at CBI in December, 2017. I was given some restrictions in my fundraising, the most important of

which was that this had to be a "Neil Yaris fundraiser". All emails would have to be sent from my personal email address and the formal name of the ambucycle on the Hatzalah website had to be something other than "CBI". With that in mind, I moved ahead.

To date, we have raised over to \$28,000 for the ambucycle. Although I am not quite at the \$36,000 goal, they allowed us to name it at this time. If people wish to donate, they do need to know that it is listed amongst the United Hatzalah mitzvah programs on the website israelrescue.org under the name "Yaris". Going forward, as our ambucycle saves lives, all donors will be updated via email.


# JOURNEYERS' MINYAN RETURNS NOVEMBER 28, 2021
